Provides senior high school, post-secondary and continuing education courses.

Offers a general education, emphasizing the natural sciences, humanities and social sciences. Offers undergraduate degree programs in arts, science and education as well as pre-professional training for faculties such as law, medicine, dentistry and social work.

Offers a graduate program in Theology, a Master of Marriage and Family Counselling and an undergraduate degree in Native Ministry. With the University of Manitoba, provides master's level programs in history, religious studies and public administration.

Admission to the university as a regular status student is based on specific high school requirements. Those who do not meet this criteria but are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident and at least 21 years of age may qualify for admission as a mature student.

Sessions are held day and evenings through the year.

Aurora Family Therapy Centre: Ph: 786-9251, 2S03, Sparling Hall; Offers marriage, family and individual counselling, with fees based on ability to pay. Provides training for professionals in the field of marriage and family therapy.

Provides Counselling Program for Family Members of Homicide Victims, with referral from Manitoba Justice, Victim Services.

Bookstore: Ph: 786-9706, 1st Floor Centennial Hall; Sells textbooks, supplies, stationery and University of Winnipeg clothing to students and the general public.

Collegiate Division: Ph: 786-9221, Room 2W04 Wesley Hall; Offers the Senior 2, 3 and 4 levels (Grades 10 to 12) of the high school program. Operates winter, spring and summer sessions. Collegiate students share in the use of all university facilities.

Continuing Education: Ph: 982-6633, 346 Portage Ave, R3C 0C3; Offers non-credit courses, certificate and diploma programs for part-time students including day, evening and weekend classes. Areas of study include Computers, Management Studies, Communications, Executive Edge Seminar Series, Educational Assistant, Seniors' Program, English as an Additional Language (EAL) and conversational French, Spanish, Japanese, German, Russian, Italian and Mandarin Chinese.

Full time courses in English as a Second Language, university preparation courses and bridge programs are also offered.

Duckworth Athletic Centre: Ph: 786-9349, Facility Information; 400 Spence St; Facilities include basketball, volleyball, racquetball and squash courts, a jogging track and weight room. The Centre is available for community use. The general public may purchase passes to the track, weight and racquet courts.

Institute of Urban Studies: Ph: 982-1140, 103 - 520 Portage Ave; Provides resources, research information and educational services to the community on urban concerns such as housing, planning, special service evaluation, sustainable urban development, native studies and market studies. Encourages citizen participation in community research and development projects. Library is open to the public.

Library: Ph: 786-9808, Circulation, 4th Floor Centennial Hall; Facilities are open to the public who may borrow stack books by purchasing a yearly card for \$25.

Menno Simons College: Ph: 786-9895, 210 - 520 Portage Ave, R3C 0G2; Offers interdisciplinary programs in conflict resolution and international development studies. Maintains close ties to the University's Chair in Mennonite Studies.

Nathan Micay Disability Resource Centre: Offers assistance, including academic advising, orientation, admission and registration, special examination and classroom arrangements, and adaptive equipment, to students with disabilities. Call the Centre's Coordinator at Ph: 786-9771 as soon as possible after acceptance; works with high school staff and funding agencies to ease transition to university.

Prairie Women's Health Centre of Excellence: Ph: 786-9048, 2C11A, Centennial Hall; Conducts policy-oriented research aimed at improving the health status of Canadian women. Is sponsored by the University of Winnipeg, the University of Manitoba and The Women's Health Clinic.

Safewalk: Ph: 781-4258, offers students and staff a safewalk to their vehicle or home within a reasonable distance of the University, 7:30 pm - 11:30 pm Mon to Thu. When the Safewalk program is not operating, Security Services will provide safewalk services (24) hours a day on request. The normal boundaries for safewalk are Sargent Ave to the north, Sherbrook St to the west, St. Mary Ave to the south, and Memorial Blvd to the east.

Student Counselling Services: Ph: 786-9231, Room 1B08, Bryce Hall; Offers academic, vocational and personal counselling in group and individual sessions for students once admission process to the university is complete. Maintains an educational library on graduate school programs, college and university calendars and other resource material.

Learning Skills services are provided year round. Include seminars on learning how to learn, development reading program and exam preparation.
